REFERENCE LABORATORIES USED BY JMCGH LABORATORY

While the patient is under hospital's care, all laboratory testing is done in the hospital's laboratory or approved reference laboratories. When organized central pathology and clinical laboratory services are not offered, the hospital identifies acceptable reference or contract laboratory services. Reference and contract laboratories meet applicable federal standards for clinical laboratories. The laboratories currently used and purpose are listed below. The laboratory director, in consultation with the institutional medical staff or physician clients (where appropriate), is responsible for selecting referral laboratories. All reference lab reports are retained and become part of medical record. Identity of performing lab is apparent within report and is located in a lab document tab as an outside lab report with lab reporting name so indicated. No other lab testing is incorporated into the laboratory medical record. Separate tabs are available in the institution EMR for physicians to access office records. All reference labs notify MCL of any critical value they obtain which we then report to the primary caregiver, followed up with documentation.
